As communicated each child is assigned to a specific whanau group and learning coach. This key person is the designated teacher responsible for the pastoral care of your child.

Whilst your child will spend time with other coaches in the learning studios, the designated whanau coach for your child is the first point of contact for communication. We are committed to building quality relationships with your child and you as whanau/caregivers; and value the importance of strong family partnerships.

Our learning coaches can be contacted by email or by phoning the school office to make an appointment. In all instances we will endeavour to respond to your communication in a timely fashion (within 24 hours with the exception of weekends), however ask that if it is an urgent matter please phone the school office on 07 5790990.

Travel to and from school:

We are excited to hear that a number of students are wanting to bike, scooter and walk to school. We want to encourage this as much as possible particularly as children become familiar with how to get to and from school; and you are happy with the safest route. We hope that you will encourage this, particularly for older children. We do want to emphasis the importance of helmets and footwear when using bikes and scooters.

We have designated a scooter and bike area in our carpark as a temporary measure. Our future plan includes a designated area behind the new build block, which will be fenced and secured.

If you are planning to drop off children to school we ask for your assistance with the use of the drop zones. The area directly in front of the hall and administration buildings is an "Immediate Pick Up and Drop Off Zone" where you will pull in and children exit the vehicle on the left hand side. This is a NO PARKING area to ensure smooth flow of traffic. The speed limit in this should not exceed 10km. At this stage we ask that this area is left for dropping off junior students who are still familiarising themselves with school life. For more senior students we ask that you use the external road-side drop off area or further afield on Mortlake Heights or Kennedy Road and they use the pathways provided. Please use the pedestrian crossing. A teacher will be stationed here.
